

Caregiving in Wisconsin

18% of Wisconsinites (**1 million people**) provided informal caregiving to a family member or friend in the past month.

An additional **15%** plan to become a caregiver in the next two years.

Care Providers

Average age = **51**

55% are female

45% are male

62% of caregivers are employed



Care Recipients

Average age = **68**

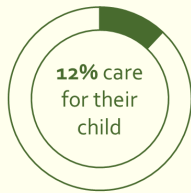
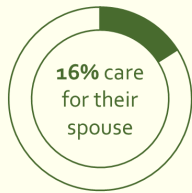
62% are female

Caregiving Crosses Many Different Relationships



Caregiving is Time Consuming

The average caregiver spends **20 hours/week** on caring.

15% spend **40 hours/week** or more providing care.

33% have been providing care

for **5 years or more.** Caregivers

provide **\$7 billion** worth of **unpaid labor** yearly.

Better relationship with care recipient

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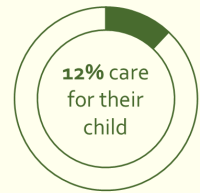
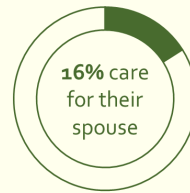
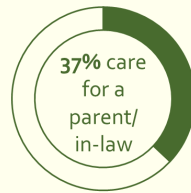
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
