UW-EXTENSION PROGRAMMING ROLES OVERVIEW

Associate Extension Educator (Academic staff; county, multi-county, or tribal)

- Focused on teaching, delivering programs, and providing educational services throughout the county or tribe.
- Leverage curricula and educational materials developed through statewide resources.
- Affiliates with an Institute and Extension Program and naming follows Extension Program or Branded Program (Financial Security Associate Extension Educator)

Extension Educator (Academic staff; county, multi-county, or tribal)

- Independently adapt research-based information into educational programs/curricula
- Deliver educational programs to county or tribal audiences
- Affiliates with an Institute and Extension Program and naming follows Institute (e.g., Health & Well-Being Extension Educator)

Program Coordinator (Academic staff; county, multi-county, or tribal)

- Focused on implementation of existing programs, coordination of training events, volunteer coordination, and providing operational support to programs within a county or tribe.
- Affiliates with an Institute and Extension Program and naming follows Extension Program or Branded Program (e.g., 4-H Program Coordinator, Horticulture Program Coordinator)

Outreach Specialist (Academic staff; county, multi-county, tribal, regional, or statewide)

- Specialized content expertise focused on developing and delivering programming and providing technical assistance
- Affiliates with an Institute and Extension Program and naming follows Extension Program or Branded Program (e.g., Local Government Outreach Specialist)



UW-EXTENSION PROGRAMMING ROLES OVERVIEW

Outreach Program Manager (Academic staff; statewide)

- Works with colleagues to coordinate the Extension activities within the disciplinary focus of an Extension Program, maintain and expand partnerships, and leverage resources
- Develops and delivers programming within area of expertise and may have limited supervisory and budget management responsibilities

Extension Faculty (Faculty; regional or statewide, also includes existing county, multi-county, or tribal faculty)

- Identifies and performs applied research and scholarship in a specialized discipline in support of Extension programs
- Incorporates research-based information into educational programs/curricula
- Delivers educational programs to national, statewide, county or tribal clientele
- Affiliates with an Institute and Extension Program

Institute Director (Academic staff – limited appointment)

- Responsible for providing support and strategic guidance for programming within the Institute.
- Oversee the budget for the institute and manage the ongoing operations of the Institute.
- Supervised by Associate Dean



UW-EXTENSION PROGRAMMING ROLES OVERVIEW

Program/Reserve Director (Academic staff – limited appointment)

- Extension Reserves and Branded Programs may be led and managed by Directors who report directly to the Institute Director.
- May be part-time or full-time administrators, depending on the level of responsibilities, number of staff within the program/reserve, and complexity of policies and practices required to operate the program/reserve.

Associate Dean (Academic staff – limited appointment)

- Reports directly to the Dean of Cooperative Extension and member of Dean's Leadership Team
- · In Extension, required to be qualified for ranked faculty status
- Manage and allocate the budget for the Department and develop and maintain funding partnerships between the Department and other groups like UW campuses and state agencies.



EXTENSION PROGRAMMING STRUCTURES

INSTITUTES

- · Programming covers multiple topics
- Faculty / staff are aligned with an institute
- Represent budgetary home for all programming positions

EXTENSION PROGRAMS

- Located within institutes
- Each has an associated Outreach Program Manager
- Faculty / staff have a primary emphasis that aligns with an extension program within their institute

MULTIDISCIPLINARY INITIATIVES

- Promote work across disciplines related to important or emerging topics
- Initiatives are designated by Associate Deans and are required to produce an annual plan of work that will be used to set budget allocations, similar to teams
- Process is being designed for colleagues to nominate new initiative ideas. Initiatives are led by a voluntary Initiative Leader or Leaders

BRANDED PROGRAMS

- Have an established brand identity
- Typically have a unique extramural funding source
- Faculty / staff are hired to work exclusively within a branded program

EXTENSION RESERVES

- Develop programs specific to certain facility or location owned and / or operated by Extension
- Faculty / staff are hired to work within a reserve which is their primary emphasis

TEAMS

- Develop, implement and evaluate statewide, tribal and county-based programming within a specific area of focus
- Teams are designated by the Institute Director and are required to produce an annual plan of work to set budget allocations
- Process is being designed for colleagues to nominate teams

WORKGROUPS

- Voluntary assemblages of colleagues around area of mutual interest
- Entirely self organizing (not designated by Institute Directors) with no required plan or expected budget allocation
