

How to access the Department of Public Instruction's certified data related to language

- 1. Go to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's (DPI) WISEdash Public Portal.
- 2. Scroll down to the "User Help" section of the page. Select "Download statewide data files".



 This takes you to the <u>WISEdash Data Files by Topic</u> page. From the dropdown menu titled "Download Type", select "Native Language".



4. Download the most recent zip file "<u>native_language_certified_2023-24.zip</u>". Open the downloaded zip folder and review both the data disclaimer and layout files.

5.	Open the data set itself, titled "native_language_certified_2023-24". Rows 2 - 325 are aggregate
	statewide data. Starting at row 326, Native Language and English Language Learner status are
	presented by county and school district.

Note: Per DPI, "Native Language" is the language or dialect first learned by a child or first used by the child's Parent/Guardian. This term is often referred to as primary language.
